Glossary of Terms

Academic Year - The 12-month period of time generally extending September to August

College Level Math – MATH 1314 College Level English – ENGL 1301

Completion - Final grade given (student did not withdraw)

Success - Final grade given (A, B, C or P)

Success is calculated two ways; percent of completers and percent of enrolled

Continuing Education (CE) - At LSCS Continuing Education consists of Career and Technical Education, Community Education, Academy for Lifelong Learning, Discovery College and Corporate Training

Delivery Method-Face to Face, Online or Hybrid

DS (Developmental Studies)
Math— MATH 0306, 0308, 0310, 0312
Reading—ENGL 0304, 0305
Writing—ENGL 0306, 0307

Dual Credit Student - Simultaneously completing a high school and college course for credit at both levels

Enrollments-Students are counted once for each course they are enrolled in.

Enrollment Status

Full-time Student – Enrolled in 12 or more semester credit hours Part-time Student – Enrolled for less than 12 semester credit hours

ESOL—English for Speakers of Other Languages

FTIC (First Time in College) - Student with 0 credit hours at start of term

Gatekeeper Courses -

Graduation Rates—The 3, 4 and 6 year graduation rates are based on first-time, full-time entering students who graduate within 3, 4 or 6 years.

Headcount -

Duplicated – Total of all campuses' unduplicated headcounts equals system duplicated headcount. Unduplicated – Students counted once for system.

Persistence Rate

Fall to Fall – Percent of previous fall (unduplicated) students who return to any LSCS campus or online program the following fall.

Fall to Spring - Percent of previous fall (unduplicated) students who return to any LSCS campus or online program the following spring.


