Dallas College Student Demographics

Dallas College, formerly the Dallas County Community College District, consists of seven campuses: Brookhaven, Cedar Valley, Eastfield, El Centro, Mountain View, North Lake and Richland.


Enrollment

Dallas College served 103,241 credit and 28,284 continuing education students Fall 2023-Summer 2024.

By gender, 26,171 male (40.8%) and 37,985 (59.2%) female students are attending Dallas College.

By attendance status, there are 14,830 full-time students (23%) and 49,326 part-time students (77%).

The number of students at Dallas College is very large compared to Public, 4-Year Colleges in Texas.



Student Progress Grades Process

Reporting Schedule

- Courses 15 weeks or longer will have TWO student progress reports. The first report will be between weeks 5 and 6 and the second will be between weeks 9 and 10.
- Courses 5 weeks to 14 weeks long (including 8-week courses) will have ONE student progress report near the midpoint of the course.
- Courses 4 weeks long or less will have NO student progress reporting requirements.

Instructor Timeline:

- **Two business days** before your class is ready for progress report input, you will receive an email to notify you about the upcoming reporting period.
- You will have two weeks to submit a grade once a reporting period opens.

Student Progress Grades Process-cont

Input Student Progress Reports in eConnect

- 1. Login to eConnect.dcccd.edu/).
- Click Faculty Menu. Under the "My Class Information" heading, click Student Progress Reporting.
- 3. Follow the instructions on the eConnect page to record each student's progress status.
 - **a. REQUIRED:** Assign each student a Progress Status. The allowable options are A, B, C, D, F, S (Satisfactory) or U (Unsatisfactory).
 - **b. REQUIRED**: For any D, F, or U (Unsatisfactory) grade, choose a *Pre-Selected Comment Option* and/or provide a *Free-Form Text Comment* of your own (must be 150 characters or less). Comments will be visible to the student.
 - c. Optional: For any A, B, C, or S (Satisfactory) grade, choose a *Pre-Selected Comment Option* and/or provide a *Free-Form Text Comment* of your own (must be 150 characters or less). Comments will be visible to the student.





Top 6 Behaviors That Lead to Unsuccessful Midterm Progress Grades

- 1. Missing Assignments, or Assignments Not Submitted (49%)
- 2. Low Assignment or Lab Grade Performance (17%)
- 3. Missing Quiz(s) or Exam(s)(6%)
- 4. Low Quiz or Exam Grade Performance (6%)
- 5. Low Attendance or No Attendance in Classroom, Blackboard or Lab Activities (4%)
- 6. Low Participation or No Participation in Classroom, Blackboard or Lab Activities (4%)

Dallas College First Evaluation SPG ProcessSummary Findings

The majority of the comments related to unsuccessful mid term grades include students missing one or two assignments, submitting late work or not submitting assignments at all.

Standout Problems:

- -Students dropped after census date without ever attending class,
- -Online students never logged into Blackboard and/or never attempted assignments,
- -Students reported access to Blackboard issues and trouble submitting assignments in Blackboard, with a few reporting technical Blackboard issues accessing the course,
- -Missing Attempts for Completing Quizzes and Exams,
- -Students lacked focus and determination for learning to work the problems (Math)

Dallas College First Evaluation SPG ProcessSummary Conclusion

Results identify a need for **online course preparedness** and an increased understanding of the differences between online and face-to-face classroom instruction, including the additional time, higher level of responsibility and self-motivation an online course requires in addition to training on the technology aspect of online course delivery.

Improvements in **two-way communication** at an early stage of the course by faculty and by success coaches to ensure students are aware of individual faculty expectation requirements such as differences in accepting late work, make-up work and exam repeats for improving performance to a successful grade attempt

Ensure students are aware and have **access to support services and resources** available for in-classroom and outside the classroom success, including all wrap around services (financial assistance, mental health, academic student support services and student success support services)




